

Pediatric Cancer Committee

In keeping with the request from Lions International to find ways to serve this goal, the Lady Loomers formed to make knitted caps for kids going through cancer treatment. The initial goal of the Lady Loomers was to make enough caps for every kid attending Texas Lions Camp during cancer week (175 caps).

The committee began with six members; four being Lions and also two ladies from the community. We are now 11, eight being Lions and three neighbors. One of the last to join our group was a gentleman, thus, we are now The Loomers. With word of mouth and a little bit of luck, The Loomers met a group wanting to make caps. They are called the Yarn Chicks. After the merge, we are now at 23 members making caps. Lions Board of Directors approved giving caps to all who are going through treatment for cancer. All these folks have whole-heartedly chosen to make life a little bit better for others and we are blessed to have all of them.

We have delivered 175 caps to Texas Lions Camp in 2022, along with Dell Children's Hospital, Austin Hospice, Christopher House, all in the Austin area. Also, a box of caps was sent to Vanderbilt-Ingram Cancer Center in Franklin, Tennessee.




Guest Speaker August 15

A packed K-Oaks Clubhouse listened intently to Lago Vista Police Chief Gary Boshears as he deftly answered the many questions that had been polled from among our members. Following is a brief summary of some of the most important information that was shared that evening.

After taking office close to a year ago, Chief Boshears undertook the task of filling the vacant 12 positions and of updating the manual of policy. All but one position is now filled, new policy manual reflect best practices.

- Technology is being updated to allow inter-connectivity between Police and Fire Department as well as other improvements.
- The department has increased community involvement and traffic enforcement.
- All officers now have some training in dealing with mental health issues and the goal is to get all active officers certified in this area.
- Our crime rate is very low... recognized as the 16th safest city in Texas.
- Most calls for service are domestic violence related and theft from vehicles. Not break-ins, but theft from unlocked and un-secured vehicles.
- We do not suffer from drug dealing problems but from end user issues.
- Our homeless situation is comparable to similarly sized cities.
- School resource officer is under development.
- Solution for loose dogs is tickets, fines and court.
- Golf carts or other recreational vehicles are not to be driven on roads with a speed limit above 35, by minors or others without a valid driver's license. Vehicles must have a license plate, be outfitted with lights and certified as road worthy.
- Recent city-wide emergency alert notifications were an error-one (water) in judgement by the responsible official and the other (fire) a technology error.

Message in a Bottle



Lions Dick and Sue Weatherly presented a blockbuster initiative at our August 1 Business meeting. Motivated by the sudden onslaught of health issues that many of our members had recently confronted, Sue engaged in a relentless effort to find a tool to help secure the safety of those for whom one has a relationship but not to the extent of knowing who to contact in an

not to the extent of knowing who to contact in an emergency.

Message in a bottle provides a potentially life saving tool that first responders will immediately access when confronted with an emergency health situation.

Simply put, Message in a Bottle is a sheet of paper with all the pertinent medical and contact information a first responder can use to administer life saving first aid and follow-up with loved ones. Prepared

by Lions and distributed with instructions to place the medicine bottle in the freezer and then apply the provided magnet to the refrigerator door that clearly

instructs the First Responder that information is in the freezer. The initiative has received enthusiastic support from the LVPD, ESD1, Vistago Print, the City of Lago Vista and the Lago Vista Leos. It is imperative to distribute these life saving Messages in a Bottle as widely as possible. Contact Lion Dick Weatherly if you would like to help in the distribution.

Thanks to all who participated in the first ever raffle for a full brisket smoked to perfection by our own BBQ team.


The winner was Lion Dick Weatherly.
